# 100 Years of the Poppy

On the 100th Anniversary of the Poppy, we asked our Veterans what this enduring symbol continues to mean to them. Here are some of their responses:

Friends, my dad, my husband. To me... it's the memories about all the soldiers.

Remembering veterans in previous wars and up to date. It's remembrance of past wars and service men you never came back.

Veterans, and they wear them around November 11 with Remembrance day, and it's quite important because they worked hard during the war years.

A day each year to remember

It means a great deal, memory of the boys and girls who gave their life in the war

For veterans that lost their lives. They were all our buddies fighting for a cause.

I remember those who died in WW1 and WW2. It makes you question why there were wars. It's a thing to remember and forget (war)

Part of a memory, our history. It symbolizes and honours the victory or the war and it's specific fights of war

It represents the veterans and what they gave during the war. It symbolizes soldiers that went to war and never came back.

Remembering family who died in WW1, I lost 2 uncles.

Remembrance, that's where you remember our fallen comrades
